

unfamiliar area Obviously an introductory book such as this has several limitations First there are entire subbranches of morphology and syntax that are not included In terms of content this book delimits both its scope and audience by shedding new light on a subject the problems and obscurities of which look inexhaustible Therefore a book of this kind is an attempt to on the one hand to make morphology and syntax which usually appear to be incredible complicated at first glance easier and on the other hand keep the standard high so that even postgraduate students can benefit from it because the author strongly believes that students learn best by doing exercises and to this end he has added dozens of practice exercises In general these require more research or analysis beyond what can be accomplished within a single classroom period These exploratory exercises can also form the basis for short papers Therefore the book can be of immense help not only to students of linguistics and translation but also to professors of linguistics and translation and research supervisors as well as advisors around the globe and in the Arab world in particular
