

• **4 Levels of Ethics.**

- **Descriptive.**
 - What people happen to believe is right and wrong.
- **Normative.**
 - What we should believe is right and wrong, development of moral theories and principles.
- **Metaethics.**
 - The study of what ethical language actually means (not doing).
- **Applied Ethics.**
 - The application of normative principles to actual dilemmas, situations, activities.

• **Ethical Relativism.**

- Relativism is the view that there are no moral absolutes ; all views are equally valid.
 - Truth is different to different people.
 - Allows for moral disagreement.
 - Two people can legitimately be right.

• **The Argument from Disagreement.**

- Different people have different beliefs about morality
 - Therefore, there are no objective facts about morality. Relativism reduces moral claims to expressions of taste.

• **Is the "Argument from Disagreement" sound?**

- Arguments have two parts.
 - Premises : Statements in an argument that provide support for the conclusion.
 - Conclusion : A statement that indicates what the arguer is trying to prove.
 - A Valid Argument : The conclusion logically follows from the premises.
 - A Sound Argument : The argument is valid and the premises are true.
 - Therefore, the argument is not sound because the fact that peoples disagree about morality doesn't necessarily mean that morality is subjective.

• **The Problem of Moral Diversity**

- Should companies conform to local practices in order to be competitive?
 - Italian Tax Mores

• **Playing "Devil's Advocate".**

- It may be permissible to cheat if cheating is a well-known feature of the game : not following the "rules" of the game unfairly disadvantages oneself.
 - This assumes all players are aware of these rules, and free to accept or reject them : this equals the playing field.

• **Ethical Reasoning**

- **Reflective Equilibrium**
 - Strives for consistency in our moral beliefs
 - A state of balance among a set of beliefs arrived at by a process of deliberative mutual adjustment among general principles, and particular judgement.
